To be eligible for admission, you will need to complete high school courses in these areas.

**Mathematics:** 3 years

**Senior year math-based quantitative course:** 1 year

### Assured admission

### Running Start & other college-level coursework

If you have completed Running Start classes or any other college-level coursework while in high school, you should apply as a freshman to WSU. You will receive applicable college credit once we receive an official college transcript.
