

Assured admission

WSU assures admission to U.S. high school students who are ranked in the top 10 percent of their high school class or who have an unweighted cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or higher (on a 4.0 scale). assured.wsu.edu

Running Start & other college-level coursework

If you have completed Running Start classes or any other college-level coursework while in high school, you should apply as a freshman to WSU. Freshmen and transfers will receive applicable college credit once we receive an official college transcript. **transfercredit.wsu.edu**

As part of WSU's ongoing commitment to keep the cost of attending college affordable, in-state tuition was reduced by 10 percent for the 2016-17 academic year. Out-of-state tuition has increased less than \$50 total over the last five years.

ONCE YOU'RE ADMITTED TO WSU. **FOLLOW THESE EASY STEPS:**

- 1. Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov (or WASFA at readysetgrad.org/wasfa) and apply for scholarships at wsu.edu/scholarships by January 31.
- 2. Confirm your spot at WSU and pay your \$200 non-refundable deposit. my.wsu.edu
- 3. Sign up for university housing. Housing assignments are made on a first come, first served basis. On-campus housing is required for unmarried undergraduate freshmen under the age of 20. housing.wsu.edu
- 4. Register for Alive! orientation, where you will meet with an academic advisor and register for classes. Orientation is required for all new students. alive.wsu.edu
