### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission as a freshman, you will need to complete high school courses in these areas. [cadr.wsu.edu](https://cadr.wsu.edu)

**English:** 4 years  
**Mathematics:** 3 years  
**Senior year math-based quantitative course:** 1 year  
Examples: statistics, advanced level of applied math, math-based career and technical courses, chemistry, physics, etc.  
**Social sciences:** 3 years  
**Science:** 2 years  
**World language:** 2 years  
**Arts:** 1 year

#### Assured admission

WSU assures admission to U.S. high school students who are ranked in the top 10 percent of their high school class or who have an unweighted cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or higher (on a 4.0 scale). [assured.wsu.edu](https://assured.wsu.edu)

#### Running Start & other college-level coursework

If you have completed Running Start classes or any other college-level coursework while in high school, you should apply as a freshman to WSU. ## ONCE YOU'RE ADMITTED TO WSU, FOLLOW THESE EASY STEPS:

1. Complete the FAFSA at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov) (or WASFA at [readysetgrad.org/wasfa](https://readysetgrad.org/wasfa)) and apply for scholarships at [wsu.edu/scholarships](https://wsu.edu/scholarships) by January 31.
2. Confirm your spot at WSU and pay your \$200 non-refundable deposit. [my.wsu.edu](https://my.wsu.edu)
