WHERE EXACTLY IS PULLMAN?


Glad you asked! Pullman is located in eastern Washington about 75 miles south of Spokane and eight miles west of Moscow, Idaho.

Assured admission

Running Start and other college-level coursework

If you have completed Running Start classes, or any other collegelevel coursework while in high school, you should apply as a freshman to WSU. You will receive applicable college credit once we receive an official college transcript.

Completing the FAFSA/WASFA and applying for WSU scholarships are vital first steps—but don't stop there.

Use our scholarship search engine and outside sources to find other awards. We'll add scholarships from other sources to the financial aid WSU offers you!

- You can earn scholarships for community service, leadership, work experience, life experience, career goals, and more.
- · Apply for as many scholarships as you can. We suggest applying for at least 40 scholarships from outside the university.
- Amounts range from a few hundred dollars to several thousand, and you can accept any number of awards. Even a few small awards can make a big difference.

Jobs and work-study

Working while in college is very doable. There are hundreds of student-friendly jobs in the Pullman area, both on campus and off. With the state's \$11 per hour minimum wage (increasing to \$11.50 per hour in 2018), working 15 hours a week during the school year will earn you more than \$5,500 before taxes! Students in workstudy positions can earn a maximum of \$4,000 per year.

It's worth the investment

On average, a bachelor's degree brings \$1.6 million more than a high school diploma in lifetime earnings.

And how's this for value: the average mid-career salary for WSU graduates with a bachelor's degree is \$89,100, ranked among the top 15% of 4-year universities in the U.S. (PayScale College Salary Report 2016-17)

How to get to and from Pullman

There are three airports near WSU, including the Pullman-Moscow Airport just 10 minutes from campus. The Lewiston, Idaho Airport is 45 minutes south, and the Spokane International Airport is 90 minutes north. Buses run between the Spokane Airport and WSU regularly.

- → 5-hour drive from Seattle
- → 1-hour flight from Seattle to the Pullman-Moscow Airport
- → 1-hour flight from Boise to Lewiston
- → 1-hour flight from Portland to Spokane
