IT'S AFFORDABLE


With the Western Undergraduate Exchange or WUE (here we call it the Cougar Award), an out-of-state student may receive a \$10,000 award, renewable for up to four years. That can reduce out-of-state tuition to less than a California student would pay in-state in the University of California system. The cost of living in Pullman is low, and the minimum wage is high—\$11 an hour and increasing to \$11.50 in 2018.



1. APPLY FOR ADMISSION ONLINE

Optional: Apply to the Honors College. honors.wsu.edu Note: WSU is on a rolling admissions cycle and will admit students year round. Students who take the SAT or ACT more than once will have their best scores in each section combined into a "super score."

2. APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

File the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) between October 1 and January 31. fafsa.gov

3. APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Complete the WSU General Scholarship Application and as many other scholarship applications as you qualify for, using our scholarship search tool and outside sources.

Jobs and work-study

Working while in college is very doable. There are hundreds of student-friendly jobs in the Pullman area, both on campus and off. With the state's \$11 per hour minimum wage (increasing to \$11.50 per hour in 2018), working 15 hours a week during the school year will earn you more than \$5,500 before taxes! Students in workstudy positions can earn a maximum of \$4,000 per year.

It's worth the investment

On average, a bachelor's degree brings \$1.6 million more than a high school diploma in lifetime earnings.

And how's this for value: the average mid-career salary for WSU graduates with a bachelor's degree is \$89,100, ranked among the top 15% of 4-year universities in the U.S. (PayScale College Salary Report 2016-17)
